

# WOOD RIVER TRAIL

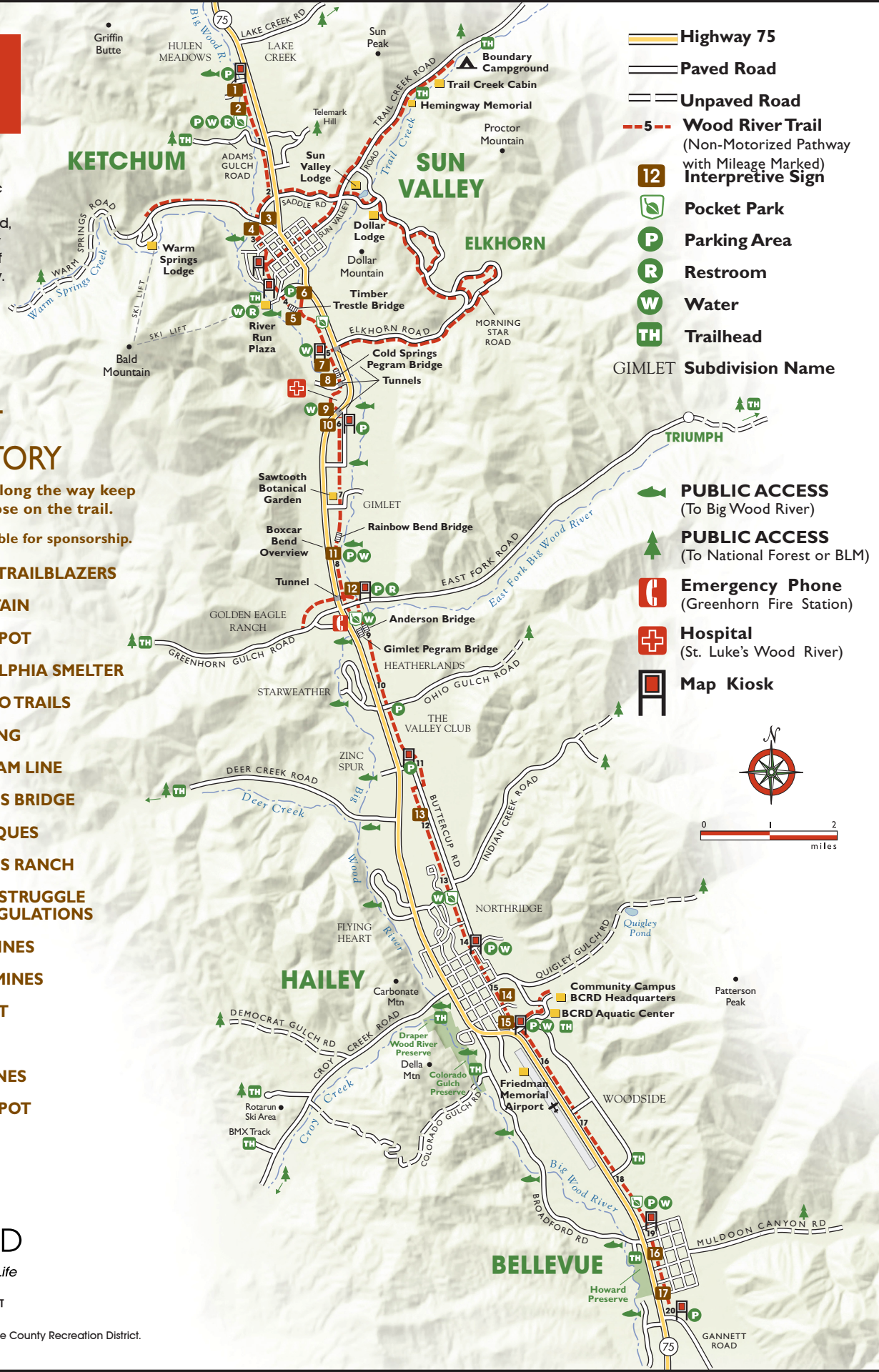
